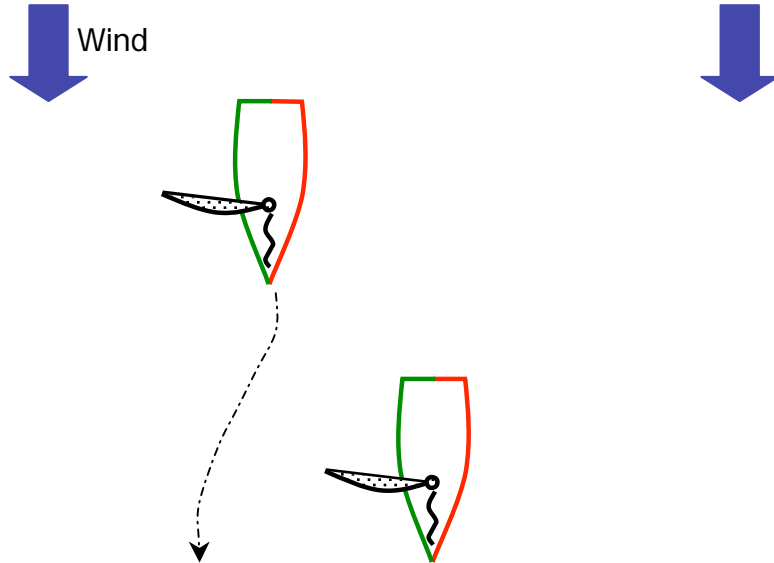


Part 3 - Overtaking boat.
An overtaking boat must always keep well clear to avoid the risk of collision.



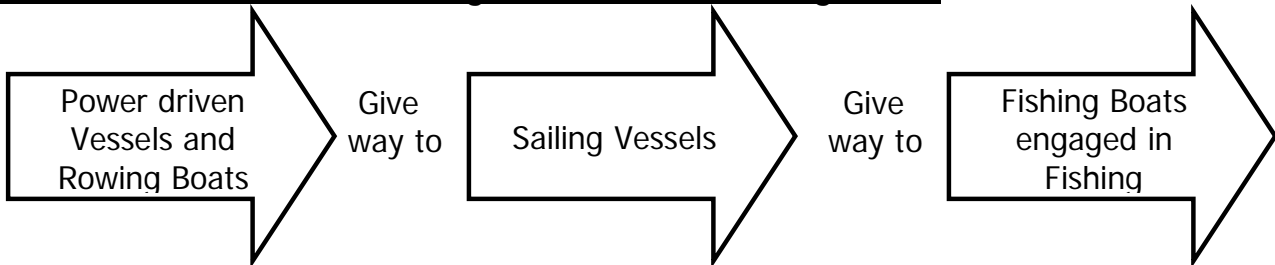
What should I do if I have Right of Way?

If you have right of way, then ensure that the other vessel has seen you. If your situation matches Part 1, call "Starboard!" or if it matches Part 2, call "Windward!" Whistles and Horns also attract attention.

What should I do if I have to Give Way?

If you are required to give way then spill the wind and stop, or make a bold change of course so that your intentions are made clear to the other vessel.

Power Driven Vessels, Fishing Vessels and Rowing Boats



Although the above rules apply, dinghy sailboats are small and easy to manoeuvre. It is therefore more common for dinghy sailors to give way to larger vessels (including sailboats) that may be restricted in their ability to manoeuvre.

--- ALWAYS REMEMBER ---

If another vessel fails to give way, as required by the Rules, the obligation is passed over to **you** to **take action to avoid a collision**.
